## A Message from Rabbi Yoshi Zweiback

#### I remember returning to my

childhood home in Omaha for the first time after spending more than a year away, studying in Israel. My mother picked me up at the airport, and on the drive back to our house, we passed what had once been a small amusement park—Peony Park—that I remembered well from my childhood. The entire park—including all the beautiful trees that provided shade on the hot summer days of my youth—had disappeared. The park had failed financially. Investors bought up the land and it was being turned into a shopping center.

I felt sad in a way that took me by surprise. I hadn't been back home in more than a year. I hadn't been to Peony Park since I was in elementary school, and yet, seeing it disappear broke my heart.

**Returning to a place filled with memories** can be an emotional experience. It can be quite complicated. We might feel joy and sadness at the same moment. We know that change is inevitable but that doesn't mean that it's always easy or pleasant.

This is our season of return: to the sounds of the High Holy Days, the call of the *shofar*, the wisdom of our tradition, and to the embrace of our community.

For some of us, these Days of Awe might represent our first physical return to our Stephen Wise Temple campus in many years. For others, it might be our first time gathering together as a community in large numbers since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. Memories of a child's graduation from Wise School or a bar or bat mitzvah ceremony or a memorial service for a loved one, they all flood back.

If you've been away for a while, the campus won't look the same, and in the coming months there will be even more changes as we begin construction on our new early-childhood center. Our community itself is ever-changing as new families enter and, as is inevitable, others move away or pass on.

**It can be hard to return** to a place or to a task, especially the one we are engaged in right now: the hard work of *teshuvah*, turning away from behaviors that are harmful and hurtful and turning toward our better selves—the people we are meant to be.

One thing I've learned is that in a world where change is inevitable, the act of returning—hard as it sometimes is—can help us to remain more grounded, more centered, more whole.

This place is our spiritual home. Our community continues to evolve as all things must, but the **values** we stand for, the **tradition** we strive to embody, the **friendships** we nurture, and the **memories** we make and share, **these are the things we return to** that help us navigate an ever-changing world. These are the things that bring meaning to our lives.

I am so excited to be a part of the Wise community, which welcomed me with such warmth when I arrived this summer.

Our AMC summer camp allowed me the joy of visiting our classrooms and seeing the children explore new centers, create beautiful objects in the art studio, and enjoy wet and fun outdoor activities. It filled me with excitement and anticipation for the coming year, as we began to prepare our outstanding staff and watched the daily progress of our Lower Village renovations—the first stage of what will be a \$30 million construction project that will transform early childhood education at Wise.

> As Rosh Hashanah approaches, we take a moment to reflect on last year and prepare to welcome the one ahead. Each new year brings us new opportunities, new lessons, and new experiences.

One of the many emergent curriculum lessons our children learn about Rosh Hashanah is about the holiday's special foods. They learn that we eat apples and honey to taste the sweetness we hope the new year brings. They learn that the circular challah is round because it symbolizes the end of one year and the **beginning** of the next. They learn that the

pomegranate—*rimon*, in Hebrew— is filled with hundreds of seeds (some people say 613!) that represent the many good deeds/*mitzvot* we can do to make the world a better place. Before we eat the fruit, we teach our students a blessing asking God to help make our good deeds equal to the number of seeds in the pomegranate.



The **Center for Tikkun Olam** is our center for making our world better for all through the efforts of our Wise members. This past year has truly been amazing, and many of the following efforts (and more) will continue throughout the coming year.

We joined with Congregation B'nai Jeshurun of Short Hills, N.J., to help fund a series of charter flights from Moldova to Israel through **United Hatzalah of Israel's Operation Orange Wings**, taking volunteer medics and more than 20 tons of food, medicine, and supplies to aid victims of the Russian invasion of Ukraine. On those flights' return to Israel, they have carried a total of more than 230 Ukrainian refugees to safety.

#### We sponsored a young adult woman who fled

**Afghanistan** and sought refuge in the United States. Wise's dedicated team assisted her by securing housing, health care, support as she finished her master's degrees, legal resources for securing asylum, as well as moral support as she integrated herself into American society.

We are *working on realizing the Wise Inclusivity Vision* through the efforts of a dedicated group of lay leaders and staff supporters. We have committed ourselves to creating a culture of belonging where all who desire to be a part of our community will feel welcomed and embraced, regardless of race, religious identity, ethnicity, gender,

sexuality, or political perspective. Working deliberately and intentionally we seek to create a process unique to Wise that will strengthen the ties that bind us all as a community.

Through *Homes for Heroes*, we have supported formerly-unhoused veterans as they secure housing. Wise provides needed household items to help create homes for our nation's heroes.



In partnership with the interfaith efforts of *L.A. Voice* and the *Religious Action Center of California*, we seek to fashion a state that supports all its residents.
